Workbooks

- Check to ensure learning is correct.
- You could use the contents page to tick off and date when work is completed.

Writing notes on a schedule

What the planned learning was	Review
English – task, resources, planned outcome.	How the learning went, successes and challenges.
Maths – task, resources, planned outcome.	What resources were used; how many pages / what modules were completed.
Science – task, resources, planned outcome.	Time spent learning. Things to consider for next session.
